The 36th Annual Floral City Strawberry Festival is a salute to our local agriculture with fresh strawberries hand-picked right around the corner from the festival at Ferris Groves. Luscious strawberry shortcakes will be available for your noshing pleasure, along with flats and half-flats of whole fresh berries that you can take home with you as a sweet souvenir of your day to make your own delectable treats.

Saturday morning, the festival opens with the posting of Colors, the Pledge of Allegiance, and our National Anthem. Live music will also fill the main stage all weekend with a full performance lineup! Saturday will kick off with music from crowd favorite, Southern Express Band from 10 A.M. – 1 P.M., followed by local talent, Ashley Young, from 1:15-2:45, then our headliner Homegrown: The Zac Brown Band Experience takes the stage from 3 P.M. - 5 P.M. Sunday's lineup includes Bad Luck Penny from 10 A.M. – 12:30 P.M. with headliner Palomino Blonde closing out this year's festival from 1 P.M. - 4 P.M.

Sticking to its very berry American roots, the annual pie-eating contests and princess pageants will be back as well! Ooh and ahh on Saturday morning as poised young ladies take the stage in their favorite strawberry-themed attire for a chance to earn a crown and



become the next Strawberry Princesses. Or maybe getting messy is more your style? Then sign up FOR FREE to compete in the strawberry pie-eating contests for your shot at bragging rights until next year! Competitions will be held both Saturday and Sunday with registration beginning at 10am that day at the festival.

While visiting the 36th Annual Floral City Strawberry Festival visitors are invited to tour the Historic Duval-Metz House in Floral City. Considered to be the oldest home in Citrus County, it will be open during festival hours both Saturday, March 4th, and Sunday, March 5th, along with the Floral City Heritage Museum in the Town Center just across the street. Guests can also take a stroll downtown to see the beautiful Avenue of the Oaks and charming local shops for a

true "taste" of Old Florida. Shuttles will run all day Saturday and Sunday from the festival grounds to the Town Center. Look for the bus marked "Downtown".

New this year, we are excited to welcome The Soccer Collies! They are a professional team of soccer-playing Border Collies, right out of Floral City, on a Mission to connect the soccer world with the dog rescue world. Once an hour participants will be able to form a circle around a Soccer Dog and a very soft ball. When the dog pushes the ball out of the circle, then the dog has scored a goal! Floral City Strawberry Festival hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday, and 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Sunday. Entrance fee is \$5.00 for adults, children 12 and under are free. Park free at the Citrus County Auditorium and take a shuttle to the festival location.
