# Twisted Oaks Golf Course: A Hole-in-One for Citrus County

Twisted Oaks Golf Course has once again earned the title of Best of the Best Local Golf Course in Citrus County for the eighth consecutive year. That kind of consistency does not happen by accident, and much of the credit goes to General Manager and PGA Golf Professional Tommy Lyman, whose leadership has guided the course from its past challenges into today's award-winning success.

Built in 1991 and designed by Karl Litten, Twisted Oaks plays as a semi-private facility with a full layout stretching 6,876 yards from the back tees and a par of 72. Its rolling terrain provides character and challenge, with uphill and downhill

shots, risk versus reward holes, and plenty of strategic options. Practice lovers also enjoy the chipping and putting greens, a practice bunker, and a full driving range.

For Lyman, golf has been a lifelong journey. Born in Dallas and raised in Charlotte, he turned professional in 1971 and earned PGA membership in 1976 after an extensive apprenticeship. With more than forty years in the golf industry, including decades as a head professional and general manager in Georgia and Florida, Lyman took ownership of Twisted Oaks in 2014 and has invested steadily in its growth. From upgrading the golf carts and clubhouse to focusing on course improvements, his vision has been to restore Twisted Oaks as a true golf club built on pride, service, and community.

"Without golf, it is nothing," Lyman has said of the club. "That is what I wanted to bring back into the club, the importance of someone who knows the game, runs competitions, knows the rules, and understands teaching." His approach underscores that Twisted Oaks is more than a course, it is a community asset.

Twisted Oaks also hosts numerous local tournaments and fundraisers, such as the CCBA's Jim Blackshear Memorial Golf Outing, benefiting the Boys & Girls Clubs of Citrus County, and the RACC Charity Golf Tournament, which supports nonprofits like Bridge 4 Veterans, Habitat for Humanity, and the Family Resource Center.

As a proud Chamber Member, Twisted Oaks Golf Course continues to shine as both a recreational destination and a community partner. Their eight-year streak as Best of the Best is a testament to the quality, service, and hometown pride that make them a true Citrus County favorite.
